Repent and Seek forgiveness, Obey God's Commands, Practice Love and Kindness to others. Proverbs 11: 7 "For the Lord is righteous; he loves righteous deeds; the upright shall behold his face." God loves those who pursue righteousness and seek to do what is right.

3. Walk In Faith: In John 11. Martha the Brother of Lazarus said, But, Lord," said Martha, the sister of the dead man, "by this time there is a bad odor, for he has been there four days. 'Then Jesus said, "Did I not tell you that if you believe, you will see the glory of God?" People of God, Walking in faith means relying and trusting in God when we do not understand our circumstances. Walking by faith, not sight means fixing our eyes on what is eternal. Faith is the access, the medium by which we tap into God's presence. It is faith that receives what Grace has supplied. We are called to walk by faith and not by sight. Without faith, we cannot please Him and without faith, we cannot gain access to what God has provided.

In conclusion, "As you therefore received Christ Jesus the Lord, so walk in Him:" Colossians 2:6. The Bible says, "If we confess our sins He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness" 1 John 1:9. Forgiveness is rooted in the character of God and that is why you are saved. Our God is a Marvellous God. He will do what He said He will do for you.

Let us emulate and imbibe Christ's virtues by living in peace, love and harmony with one another. Exhibit the fear of God by obeying His commandments. I enjoin our Provincial Heads and Diocesans to continue to intercede for the unity of the body of Christ.

This event will take place from July 13 to July 17 this year in Brussels, Belgium. Those interested should reach out to their minister for more information and guidance. COUNCIL OF AFRICAN AND CARIBBEAN CHURCHES UK (CACCAUK)

I am happy to report to this esteemed assembly that The Church of the Lord UK is now leading the CACCAUK. During the Council's meeting held late last year, I was appointed as the Acting President, and at our General Meeting on January 17, 2026, I was elected as the President of the Council. At this meeting, Venerable John Fawole was elected as the Moderator, and Deacon Dapo Ogunrinde was elected as the Legal Officer for the Council. We give glory to the Lord for these elections, and we pray that His name will be glorified through our efforts in Jesus' name. The Council appreciates the tremendous moral, physical, and financial support our Church has provided to CACCAUK since its establishment about 45 years ago. I encourage everyone to continue this support and even do more now that we are in leadership. I also urge our women and youth to actively participate. I want to express my gratitude to our beloved Evangelist Dada Buwa, who consistently attends the online weekly prayer meetings, as well as Deaconess Caroline Ogunderu. We need to see more of our women participating actively in the Council. I would like to announce the upcoming program of the Council, which is a 3-in-1 event scheduled for May 2026. On that day, the following events will take place:

1. The official inauguration of the newly elected officers.
2. Presentations of awards to deserving past leaders, members, and institutions.
3. A fundraising event for the development of the Council. I ask that you keep this event in mind and prepare to attend when invitations are sent out. May the Lord grant us life beyond the dates in Jesus' name.

Achievements:

- Increase in cooperation/collaboration among ministers and member churches.
- Numerical growth across our branch churches
- Partici[ation in joint programmes- 21-Day New Year Fasting and Prayer Revival, Lenten season.
- Joint Galilee Celebration as a way to consolidate Christ's Love in the Diocese
- Participation of the Diocese at the centenary Anniversary of TCLW held at the International and Spiritual Headquarter in 7- November
- Successful Celebration of the 100th Anniversary of The Church of the Lord Worldwide in the UK on December 26th & 28th, 2025.

Challenges:

- Lukewarmness to attending services.
- Low membership participation



- Low Financial strength
- Low Tithe payment: the tithe generated is barely enough to pay a full-time minister, likewise, the Offering and other collections are barely enough to meet the monthly bills.

I encourage us as obedient children of God to pay our tithe and offerings as they are due. There is a blessing in doing so; this is God's command. The blessings therein shall continue to be our portion in Jesus' name.

Court Cases

The case, which was heard at the Employment Appeal Tribunal, was dismissed by the presiding judge due to a lack of disclosure from both parties, as required by the court. Mr. Michael Erinle has appealed this judgment, and we are currently waiting for the date of the hearing.

Additionally, the unlawful transfer of £57,339 belonging to the TCL North London branch's building fund—conducted in collaboration with the then minister-in-charge, Senior Pro Michael Erinle, other signatories, and also involving Dr. M. Pelling—has yet to be resolved. However, efforts are underway to ensure the return of the funds.

Plans for the Year 2026

The following among others are the plans of the Diocese for the year 2026:

- To engage in aggressive evangelistic and life-transforming programmes that will enhance the growth of the Diocese spiritually, numerically, and financially.
- To have a modest 10% increase in membership year 2025
- Diocese Crusade- 19-21 June 2026
- To invest in property for financial stability
- To Continue the renovation/landscaping of the Church Headquarters to meet the safety and aesthetic standards of a modern place of worship.
- Construction of residential and community hall at the back of the church building (Tagged PROJECT JERICHO)- the process is ongoing. May the Lord grant His Church speedy progress and completion.
- Purchase of a place of worship in any of the places where we have our churches situated other than Surrey Square.
- Embark on more charitable and community works/projects e.g., Community School
- The Re-evaluation of Liverpool Land for greater gain for the Church.
- To establish Diocese Bible College for those who want to know more about God and develop spiritually (for Discipleship and Spiritual Formation)

09 AD-HOC COMMITTEE REPORT/RESPONSES: + **PROJECT JERICHO BUILDING. 12:10-1:10PM**

Pastor Ajayi delivered the report. There has not been an opportunity for the churches to read their reports for the past two church conferences. It was agreed that the committee should also review the reports of each of the church branches.

Below is a summary of the suggestions made by the committee:

- Ministers to be more vigour in to push forward the evangelical ministry
- Elect three people to meet with the youth to understand the problem with the youth ministry as it is impacting them
- Elders and laities are overstretched, there were no meetings, and some councils didn't have leaders. They need to come together as a council to pray.
- Evangelism is essential for church growth. Ministers call and visit members more often.
- Membership to the CEC should be explained to the church so that we can understand the benefits to the church.
- Band leaders should assist with lukewarmness and call on members who are not in church.

Below are the responses to the Ad-hoc Committee report from the delegates:

- A question was raised on how the gift aid was spent. The Archbishop gave an account, and the following resolution was agreed.
- The conference report should include details of how the gift aid was spent for the previous year that the church accountant has already filed.

CHURCH COURT CASES REPORT

The Archbishop read the report for the Tribunal case with Mr Erinle and a case against Southwark Council regarding the tree roots.

Concern was raised that Mr. Erinle still influences the personal lives of some members. The ministers encouraged members to support the church, the Diocesan and the Church Organization and sustain it by not discussing church matters with Mr. Erinle. Members were also encouraged not to listen to or entertain gossip. Members of the conference explained that the church could do better and keep them informed of what is happening so they can defend themselves and correct any false information.

The report explained that the council would compensate the church for the tree issue. To date, the best approach for the church has been to place a 3 m-wide barrier/trench deep and wide around the church to prevent the roots from protruding into the church compound.

PROJECT JERICHO

The Rev came out to explain the Jericho project, which involves building a conference hall and flats in the church, and give an update on our progress. We need the signatures of the council and our legal representative.

- Questions were asked about how it would be funded
- This project comes under the investment committee.

Given the rise in utility bills by service providers, additional funds are needed to meet our monthly obligations. May the Lord bless us abundantly and open unforeseen doors of favor and breakthrough as we contribute to the growth and sustenance of the church in the name of Jesus.

Collapsed Church Fence and Trees:

Glory be to God who has granted His amazing breakthrough regarding the Council Trees damaging the Church fence. The Council has compensated us with £17000 to fix the damaged fence.

At this juncture, we acknowledge the diligent efforts made by Deacon Dapo Ogunrinde in addressing the matter. May the Lord bless his labour of love in the name of Jesus.

Heating System:

The current heating system requires an upgrade to improve its efficiency and cost-effectiveness. The existing system takes a long time to warm up the church hall, and both the electric and boiler systems need to be modernized. Currently, heating the church for an average of four Sundays per month costs around £950 or slightly less. This amount is quite high, especially considering the church's income and other monthly expenses, such as electricity, waste disposal, Wi-Fi, and insurance. I encourage everyone at this August gathering to brainstorm on the solutions.

Challenges:

- The heating system requires an upgrade to one that is efficient and cost-effective.
- Lack of good storage for keeping items, makes the surrounding of the church tatty
- Toilet facilities need to be upgraded to be disability friendly
- Retention of new members.
- Low levels of tithe and offerings.
- Ineffective Musical Instrument

INVESTMENT COMMITTEE ANNUAL REPORT 2025

The decision was made 3 years ago to focus our efforts on the building project tagged, Project Jericho. To this end, all the committee's activities in 2025 have been focused on the preparation and submission of a planning application to Southwark Council.

Planning permission is the first stage of any construction activities in the UK. To streamline communications with the Council and our hired Design Team (Greencode Architects) – on behalf on the committee, most of the activities this year were performed by the Project Jericho executive team, comprised of His Grace, Archbishop E. Gbogboade, Rev. Ambrose Sraha and Elder O'Neil Joe. In addition, we would like to make special mention of our Father in the Lord His Holiness Dr R. O. Ositelu; the Primate of our Church for his advice, encouragement and for the personal interest he has taken to ensure the success of this project.

Project Jericho Annual Report 2025

Executive Summary

Southwark Council is in the final stage of deciding whether to grant us planning permission. The deadline for council to complete its assessment of our application was July 2025. The process has been long and very thorough. Council has requested much information and many types of reports each with its own cost. However, our team alongside our hired Architects have dealt with it in a professional manner and answered all the questions posed by the council regarding the project. The council has requested additional documentation from the church. The church is in the process of providing the final documentation for the council to give the approval for planning permission. We continue to pray for a favourable outcome.

Project achievements

The schedule of works planned for the year was to take us to the completion. We also aimed to ascertain the view of the local council on whether or not the project was going to be acceptable. To achieve this over the last 3 years, we followed the steps as per the design recommendation produced by the institute of architects:

- 01 Measured survey – completed.
- 02 Client brief – completed.
- 03 Feasibility study – completed.
- 04 Design options – completed.
- 05 Drafting Design – completed.
- 06 Pre-planning submission – completed.
- 07 Planning submission – completed.
- 08 Responses to questions by the council – completed.
- 09 Additional reports requested by the council – completed.
- 10 S106 document has been received from council – awaiting return of further documentation from the church.

A Section 106 (S106) is a legal agreement between Church of The Lord and Southwark council planning authority.

Conclusion

In Summary, next steps in the process are:

1. Church to return additional documentation requested by Southwark council.
2. Church to submit the signed S106 documentation to Southwark council.
3. Southwark council to grant us planning permission.

TREE REPORT

The Church of the Lord Aladura Worldwide
25 Surrey Square, London, SE17 2JU

The Church fence on the right side of the main entrance was damaged from about 23 April 2019 (claim was formally raised) and it grew worse on or about 14 February 2020 by the adjoining tree maintained and owned by the local authority. The tree leaned to the fence of the organisation and caused considerable damage. A report was made to the local authority to abate the nuisance and repair our fence. Subsequently, the organisation insurance company was contacted and a claim was lodged for the local authority to repair the fence.

The organisation was subsequently required to obtain expert advice from an Arboriculturist. We were also requested to provide the following:

- Arb report
- Soil Analysis
- Root Analysis
- Site investigation

An Arboriculturist Report was provided by a Jon Hartley BSc(Hons) MArborA of Arbtech Consulting Ltd on 07 March 2020 (the report is about 16 pages and can be provided to members on request by email). The cost for the report is £ 489.00 plus VAT. Please see the link to the details of the provider of the report; The report in summary stated as follows:

- "In summary the report states that the Council's London plane tree T01 has impacted the Church's boundary wall and destroyed the corner pillar. Furthermore the Church's wall cannot be repaired with the tree in situ."

The report also states that given the close proximity of the Council's trees to the Church's boundary wall, it is very likely that structural roots of the tree have grown beneath the foundations of the boundary wall and that this could have impacted the foundations of the wall and caused or contributed to the deflection and deformation of the wall.

As T01 has damaged the Church's wall, I believe the Council have caused a nuisance. As the tree is likely to have been subject to a maintenance programme, I believe that the Council should have identified the risk of damage to the wall by their tree and taken steps to abate the nuisance by, for example, pruning or removing the tree. Therefore, I believe that you can seek to recover the costs of repairing the damage caused to the part of the wall that has been damaged by the tree. It also appears that the Council should remove T01 to enable your wall to be rebuilt, however, it may be necessary for me to clarify what works need to be carried out to the tree to abate the nuisance by asking your Arboriculturalist.

The report is very vague about whether trees T02-T09 are causing or will very imminently cause damage to the boundary wall. The report only states that the tree roots could be impacting the foundations of the wall but does not confirm whether they presently are or the imminency of this occurring. Furthermore, the report goes on to say that 'if it is accepted, or can be proven, that the trees have caused or contributed to the deformation/partial destruction of the boundary wall their owner may be liable'. However, the report does not go into any detail about the likelihood of these trees causing damage. Therefore, I do not believe that you will succeed in showing that these trees are causing a nuisance."

A letter of claim was served on the local authority on 05 May 2020, and Council's Loss Adjuster confirm that the Council will remove the tree on 28 February 2021. This should then enable the organisation to obtain a quote for repairs of the fence.

The local authority subsequently refused to remove the tree on 28 February 2021 asserting objections from the local residents and the member of parliament that lives on Surrey Square.

By 25 February 2022 the draft particulars of claim was prepared to proceed to litigate the matter in court. By 08 June 2022, the local authority now requested that the organisation boundaries be moved in order to retain the tree. The local authority in order to bolster their position served an order in 2023 called TPO , meaning Tree Preservation order that the trees cannot be removed. This order became a protracted legal tussle for considerable number of years. As there is a TPO in place then there is no merit in issuing court proceedings, and we are faced with how best a new wall can be erected whilst the trees remain. It is worthy to note that the costs can then be recovered from the local authority.

The local authority despite admitting liability also issued another TPO in 2025, Tree Preservation Order No 761 2025, which the organisation also challenged. On 23 October 2025, the local authority asserted that the organisation has damaged the tree, and the organisation challenge of the order based on the following grounds:

01 The local authority to provide a written confirmation on procedure to contain the root from encroaching unto the foundation and the wall.

02 Confirming in writing that the leave of the trees will be contained outside the fence of the organisation land.

03 The local authority will immediately erect a lintel to breach the roots from the side of the local authority land.

04 The local authority to provide internal assessment on the impact of the trees (TP01 to TP07), on the organisation land.

We are still awaiting the response of the local authority as at 05 November 2025 to respond to the above and resolve the challenge to the TPO.

On 28 November 2025, the local authority formally accepts payment of the sum of £ 17, 000.00 for the repair of the fence.
